Dear Friends,

We are halfway through Lent. This coming Sunday, March 6, is rose Sunday. The rose (or faded violet) vestments and altar hangings are a sign that our Lenten sacrifice and discipline will soon be over, and there is light at the end of the spiritual journey tunnel. That end, of course, is the Feast of the Resurrection-Easter Day.

Easter is one of the greatest days in the Church. It is the day that we celebrate the mystery of the resurrection and how we share in that resurrection to eternal life through our baptism. However, before we get to Easter, we have the rest of Lent especially Holy Week. One of the most meaningful times in our Church year, Holy Week is when we walk with Christ through the events of His last week before the crucifixion.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday. After His long journey to Jerusalem, Jesus entered the city as the peopled gathered shouting "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!!" We will on Palm Sunday gather outside with our branches of Palm and sing "Blest be the King whose coming!" joining Jesus on His triumphant entry!

While each day of Holy Week represents to us events during Jesus' last week, special attention is paid to the sacred three days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

Maundy Thursday is the evening where Jesus is betrayed by Judas, and it is the remembrance of Jesus' Last Supper. As this service comes to an end, the altar is stripped and the church is prepared for the all night vigil as we join Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. People come for an hour at a time to respond YES to Jesus' question to His disciples "can you not stay awake with me one hour?"

Good Friday we share with Christ the suffering of the Cross through prayer and scripture. On Holy Saturday night, we celebrate the Great Vigil of Easter. In this holy and moving service, we celebrate the victory of the Light over darkness, and there is the first communion of Easter. Following this service, there is a festive agape meal (reception).

I encourage everyone to end their Lenten journey by taking advantage of Holy Week and especially the sacred three days. By walking with Jesus during His last hours, we can more fully experience the blessed joy of the discovery of that empty tomb on Easter morning.
